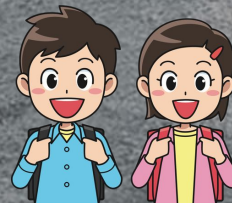

7th grade social studies has been looking at the effects that the Enlightenment had on the American colonies, including the creation of the United States and the writing of the Declaration of Independence.

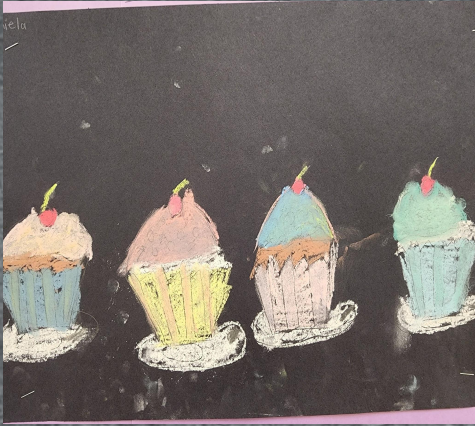


8th grade social studies has been studying the basics of why governments exist. We're now talking about the Constitution, including its creation, and the ideals that were placed in it to limit the government's power.

Cupcakes inspired by artist Wayne Thiebaud.

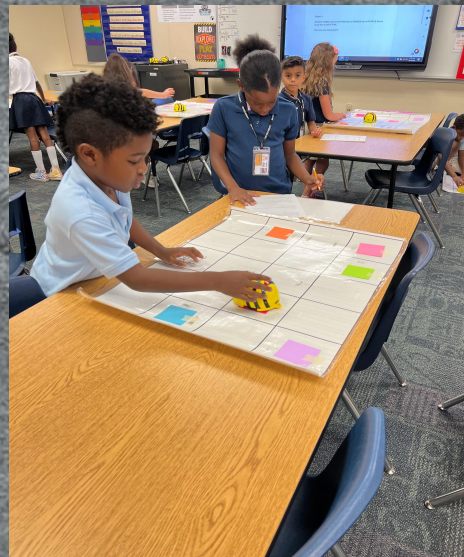
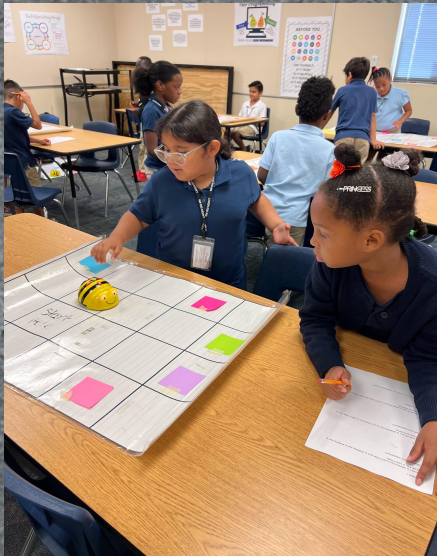


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Computer Science
